

## AMP Advocacy Update Regarding COVID-19

Dear CHAMP Community,

AMP is actively monitoring the latest developments related to the coronavirus disease (COVID-19) outbreak. With a predicted pervasive impact on the public, this outbreak underscores the urgent need for deployment of high-quality Laboratory Developed Testing Procedures (LDPs) and the involvement of appropriately trained and qualified laboratory professionals. We support and send our best wishes to our members across the globe who are working tirelessly to serve the public.

AMP is also committed to sharing our expertise with stakeholders and the broader laboratory community. We have more than 1,200 members in our Infectious Diseases Subdivision, most of whom have roles in the development and performance of accurate and reliable testing procedures; correct test utilization; professional interpretation; and/or communication of test results and their application to patient management.

I would like to give you an update regarding what advocacy we are doing to address test implementation challenges here in the U.S. Since turnaround times for these tests are critical for both patient care and surveillance, high complexity, CLIA-certified laboratories satisfying appropriate BSL requirements must have the ability to use the CDC's test kit and/or develop and validate their own LDPs to provide immediate and local patient care and to partner with public health laboratories in their mission to help contain the outbreak. AMP is actively advocating for this now and coordinating efforts and responses with several other professional organizations. Our advocacy team also plans to discuss this with congressional staff on Monday morning.
